GLOSSARY

A

Amphibious adjective

relating to, living in, or suited for both land and water.

В

Bestiary noun

a descriptive or anecdotal treatise on various kinds of animal, especially a mediaeval work with a moralising tone.

<u>C</u>

Contagion noun

the communication of disease from one person or organism to another by close contact.

Classification noun

the action or process of classifying something.

<u>D</u>

Demoniacal adjective

relating to or characteristic of a demon or evil spirit.

Ε

Exorcized verb

drive out or attempt to drive out (a supposed evil spirit) from a person or place.

Epidermis noun

the surface epithelium of the skin, overlying the dermis.

Extremes plural noun

either of two abstract things that are as different from each other as possible.

Enumeration noun

the action of mentioning a number of things one by one.

Enchantment noun

the state of being under a spell; magic.

F

Fable noun

a short story, typically with animals as characters, conveying a moral.

Fantastic adjective

imaginative or fanciful; remote from reality.

<u>H</u>

Heraldry noun

the system by which coats of arms and other armorial bearings are devised, described, and regulated.

<u>[</u>

Imagination noun

the faculty or action of forming new ideas, or images or concepts of external objects not present to the senses.

Inconceivable adjective

not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable.

Insinuate verb

suggest or hint (something bad) in an indirect and unpleasant way.

Interstitial adjective

of, forming, or occupying interstices.

<u>J</u>

Juxtaposition noun

the fact of two things being seen or placed close together with a contrasting effect.

<u>L</u>

Limitation noun

a limiting rule or circumstance; a restriction.

M

Meaning noun

what is meant by a word, text, concept, or action.

Maiden noun

an unmarried girl or young woman.

Monstrosity noun

a thing which is outrageously evil or wrong.

<u>P</u>

Polymorphous adjective

occurring in several different forms or stages.

Proximity noun

nearness in space, time, or relationship.

<u>S</u>

System noun

a set of things working together as parts of a mechanism or an interconnecting network; a complex whole.

Squamous adjective

covered with or characterised by scales.

<u>T</u>

Taxonomy noun

the classification of something, especially organisms.
